I. Consultation/first opinion care for outpatients

- 1) Consultations/surgical examination: 5,000 – 35,000 HUF
- 2) Outpatient care (e.g., infusion, medication, wound care, catheterisation, bandaging, foreign body removal, abscess opening etc.):
 - a. procedure fee: 5,000 – 30,000 HUF
 - b. material fee (infusion set, catheter, bandage etc.): 2,000 – 30,000 HUF
 - c. drug charges (infusions, injections, tablets etc.): 1,000 – 25,000 HUF

II. Surgical procedures

- 1) Anaesthesia / procedure fees:
 - a. Basic fee: from 15,000 HUF
 - b. High-risk anaesthesia: + from 15,000 HUF
- 2) Surgery / procedure fee: 25,000 – 350,000 HUF
- 3) Surgery / material fee: 10,000 – 100,000 HUF
- 4) Surgery / drug charges: 5,000 – 35,000 HUF

III. Radiology

- 1) Radiology basic fee: 15,000 HUF; 2 view study: 18,000 HUF, additional views: + 3,000 HUF
- 2) Emergency radiology basic fee: 20,000 HUF
- 3) Anaesthesia for radiography: from 4,000 HUF (high-risk patient: additional from 15,000 HUF) plus drug charges
- 4) Contrast studies (in addition to the basic fee): 5,000–40,000 HUF
- 5) CT basic fee: 110,000 – 130,000 HUF (+ anaesthesia and drug charges +emergency)
- 6) Intervention radiology (e.g., biopsy): from 20,000 HUF
- 7) Screening (e.g., dysplasia) administration fee: 20,000 HUF

- 8) CSF sampling: 40,000 HUF

IV. Surgical hospitalisation:

- 1) Hospitalisation/treatment fees/cat/day: 3 000 – 7 000 HUF (+ material and medicine)
- 2) Hospitalisation/treatment fees/dog/day: 4 000 – 10 000 HUF (+ material and medicine)

V. Laboratory tests

- 1) Blood tests and urinalysis: from 10,000 HUF
- 2) Microbiological examination: from 10,000 HUF
- 3) Urolith analysis (BUC): 11,000 HUF
- 4) Pathology: from 14,000 HUF

* Notice: The final charge consists of the fees of examination(s), procedure(s), as well as the used materials and medicines, which is also affected by the complexity, of the care and the weight of the patient. Fees are subject to change in out of hour periods, holidays, and at night emergencies. Please ask for a cost estimate from the surgeon responsible for the patient!
